




FOUR DIFFERENT TYPES OF TRANSPORTATION

- S-Bahn (Stadtschnellbahn): Mostly above-ground train throughout both the city center and suburbs
- U-Bahn (Untergrundbahn): Primarily underground trains in the city center
- Trams: Run throughout much of East Berlin and follow bus lines
- Buses: Run throughout the entire city connecting all areas of Berlin with one another





DIVIDED INTO THREE ZONES

- Zone One is the city center. This is the densest of the zones with each type of public transportation running through every neighborhood.
- Zone Two is the areas just outside of the city center
- Zone Three is the suburbs of Berlin, including Potsdam

To enter each zone, one must purchase a ticket that allows access to it. For example, if we are in the city center (Zone One) and need to get to Potsdam (Zone Three), then we must purchase a ticket that grants access to Zones One, Two, and Three.



Buying tickets is simple.
One must simply
approach one of these
machines and buy a
ticket for the desired
destination's zone.

Remember: Always activate or "punch" your ticket in the small machine next to the

ticket machine (Seen on the far left). It is required, when on the train, to have an activated ticket and if it is not, one can be fined and kicked off of the train.

We will be using the Berlin Welcome Card. This means that we have access to all Zones at all times. Just make sure to have a valid form of ID (Passport) and the printed Welcome Card Paperwork.



SOME TIPS AND TRICKS

- Before getting on the trains, always check the line and final stop. This will indicate what mode of transportation and the direction.



- Always use the "Stop" Button when approaching your desired destination on a bus or tram. The drivers do not always stop if they have no reason to, so give them one!

- Google Maps is your friend!!!!
