- Survived global conflicts and a relocation
- Home to buildings designed by Albert Speer
- Underwent transformations that allow for multiple interpretations, but continues to stand despite Berlin's volatility
- A point to look into Berlin's past and future

Stands at 66.89 m tall




## History

- Commemorates Germany's victories over Denmark, Austria and France
- Symbol of German unification
- Constructed between 1865 & 1873
- Built and designed by Johann Heinrich Strack, Friedrich Drake
  & Anton von Werner
- Originally stood in front of the Reichstag Building
- Underwent modifications during relocation in 1939




### Public Transportation & Walking
